



Decision-making procedure within the Association

iMBRA defines itself as a 21st century World Organisation, meaning that all decision-making procedures serve the main goal of being effective, professional and supporting the future of our sport.

Proposals can be made in two ways:

1) To be voted on at World Championships by member federations. Proposals must be submitted to iMBRA via the countries representative at least two months before a World Championship. Proposals received will be published prior to the World Championship to be considered by all iMBRA members. The proposals will be voted on at the members meeting held at the World Championship. Each country in attendance at the meeting will receive one vote. Following the vote any proposals that have been adopted will be implemented by the committee prior to the start of the following racing season.

2) Submitted independently from the World Championships to be voted on by the iMBRA committee. Proposals can be submitted to iMBRA by individuals and/or member federations. Proposals must be submitted by the 1st February. Any proposals made after 1st February can only be considered and if adopted become effective from 1st January the following year.

Proposals received independently from the World Championships will be considered and voted upon as follows:

1) Committee Vote (straight forward committee vote, YES or NO)

The Committee is the general managing body of iMBRA and has the right to decide which proposals are in the best interests of iMBRA and therefore should be implemented.

2) A committee member indicates the need to involve member federations in the decision-making process. The committee will vote on whether to postpone decision-making until the next members meeting, or in very urgent cases initiate an online voting process.

3) Should the vote carry from point 2, the decision will be made by the member federations at the next members meeting or via online voting. Online voting will have a clear deadline (set by the Treasurer) and the simple majority of votes received before the deadline will be decisive. Online voting can be done via emails, or other reliable online voting platforms.
